**SIMPLE ORGANISATIONAL
DOCUMENT**

1. Preamble

The Chamber of International Diplomats (CID) is a global body established to promote responsible diplomacy, international cooperation, cultural understanding, and sustainable development through the efforts of diplomats, scholars, professionals, and youth leaders from around the world.

This policy serves as a guiding framework for the governance, operation, and ethical conduct of CID and its members.

2. Vision

To become the foremost global institution advancing peaceful diplomacy, cultural exchange, and international partnerships for sustainable development.

3. Mission

- To unite diplomats, peace ambassadors, and international leaders under one platform.
- To provide diplomatic training, global networking, and research opportunities.
- To support conflict resolution, human rights, economic cooperation, and global education.
- To promote youth participation in diplomacy and international affairs.

4. Core Values

5. Standing Committees and Portfolios

a. International Affairs & Cooperation

Portfolio:

- Oversees CID’s bilateral and multilateral partnerships.
- Coordinates international diplomatic missions and cooperation agreements.
- Liaises with UN, AU, EU, ASEAN, and other diplomatic organs.

b. Peace & Conflict Resolution

Portfolio:

- Leads peacebuilding efforts, mediations, and post-conflict reconstruction programs.
- Deploys peace envoys or observers to conflict zones.
- Trains diplomats in negotiation, mediation, and conflict sensitivity.

c. Diplomatic Education & Training

Portfolio:

- Develops capacity-building programs for diplomats, youth, and public officials.
- Coordinates the CID Diplomatic Academy and training curricula.
- Certifies short courses, workshops, and diplomatic exchanges.

d. Human Rights & Justice

Portfolio:

- Advocates for the protection and promotion of human rights globally.
- Monitors violations and supports access to international justice mechanisms.
- Cooperates with civil society and human rights institutions.

e. Global Development & SDGs

Portfolio:

- Aligns CID projects with the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals.
- Mobilizes diplomatic and development partnerships for education, health, climate, etc.
- Tracks and reports on impact metrics related to Agenda 2030.

6. Code of Ethics

All CID members and representatives shall:

- Act with honesty, integrity, and professionalism.
- Avoid conflicts of interest and disclose affiliations transparently.
- Promote peace, dialogue, and cultural sensitivity.
- Respect confidentiality and organizational interests.
- Refrain from activities that bring disrepute to CID.

7. Collaboration and Partnerships

- CID shall actively engage with governments, universities, civil society, and international bodies in pursuit of its mission.
- All partnerships must align with CID's goals and be approved by the Executive Council.
- Partners may include UN agencies, diplomatic corps, youth institutions, NGOs, academic centers, and corporate social investors.

8. Training, Events & Diplomacy Programs

CID shall organize:

- Global and regional summits
- Diplomatic training workshops
- Cultural and exchange programs
- Peacebuilding missions
- Academic forums and research initiatives

Programs may be held in collaboration with national governments, educational institutions, or multilateral agencies.

9. Monitoring & Evaluation

CID shall implement mechanisms to:

- Monitor program impact
- Evaluate policy effectiveness
- Ensure compliance with ethical and financial standards

An independent audit or oversight committee may be established for accountability.

10. Amendments

This policy is subject to review and amendment by the Executive Council upon recommendation by a majority of the Advisory Board or member body. Any amendments must be communicated to all registered members and stakeholders.

11. Effective Date

This policy becomes effective on the date of ratification by the Executive Council of the Chamber of International Diplomats.

SECTION 5:

Main Objectives

1. **Promote Global Diplomacy**
 - Strengthen peaceful international relations through advocacy and engagement.
2. **Advance Peace & Conflict Resolution**
 - Mediate, educate, and advocate for nonviolent solutions globally.
3. **Foster Cultural Exchange**
 - Protect and promote diverse cultural heritage through diplomatic platforms.
4. **Support Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs)**
 - Align CID's efforts with the UN's global development agenda.
5. **Empower Youth in Diplomacy**
 - Equip young leaders with the skills and platforms to participate in diplomatic affairs.

Policies and Procedures to Form CID

1. Mission Statement

"To serve as a global platform for diplomatic professionals, promoting international cooperation, training and mentoring young diplomats, cultural exchange, and peaceful dialogue, while enhancing the professional development, policy advocacy, and global impact of diplomats across all sectors."

2. Objectives (SMART Format)

Specific:

- To create a structured and recognized body for diplomats to network, share best practices, and contribute to global diplomacy.

Measurable:

- To enroll a minimum of 100 active diplomatic professionals across 5 regions within the first 12 months.
- To organize 4 international forums or seminars annually.

Achievable:

- By leveraging existing diplomatic and international networks, partnerships with embassies, and international organizations.

Relevant:

- The objectives align with the global need for multilateral cooperation, diplomatic capacity building, and cross-cultural understanding.

Time-bound:

- Launch and officially register the chamber within 6 months.
- Develop a 3-year strategic plan and review it annually.
